A student who has been required to withdraw must make application for re-admission. Permission for re-admission may be granted by the Registrar, in consultation, if needed, with the Department Chair Co-ordinator. Initially, astudent re-admitted after being required to withdraw may enroll in no more than nine (9) credits. In LEPs, students advised to consult with the program Cordinator before selecting their courses; in programs that require students to be registered in more than nine (9) credits to maintain their status in the program, students must contact the Committed or administrator responsible for the program area beforegistering in any courses.

Once readmitted, a student returning after a required withdrawal period remains on probation and must achieve a GPA of 1.50 or better.
